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Prologue

After writing the first book, 'Powerfully Purposed Transformation', God continued to reveal much more about His kingdom structure and how it works. Revelation 10:5-7 KJV

5 And the angel which I saw stand upon the sea and upon the earth lifted up his hand to heaven,

6 And swore by him that liveth for ever and ever, who created heaven, and the things that therein are, and the earth, and the things that therein are, and the sea, and the things which are therein, that there should be time no longer:

7 But in the days of the voice of the seventh angel, when he shall begin to sound, the mystery of God should be finished, as he hath declared to his servants the prophets.

I desire that every one of His children has the knowledge to put into practice and integrate into their lives the wisdom of the full maturity and stature of Christ. God has promised that His Kingdom within us would continue to grow forever. Join me as I continue to walk into the plans that God has for my life, following Jesus into the plans God has for His life in me.

Revelation 14:3-4 KJV

(3) And they sung as it were a new song before the throne, and before the four beasts, and the elders: and no man could learn that song but the hundred and forty and four thousand, which were redeemed from the earth.

(4) These are they which were not defiled with women; for they are virgins. These are they which follow the Lamb whithersoever he goeth. These were redeemed from among men, being the firstfruits unto God and to the Lamb.

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Ch 13 The Value of Judgment

God sent Jesus here to serve as God's Ambassador, doing His will. It is the Ambassador's duty to speak only what He hears from His King. When asked, He never responds with His own judgment; He responds with His King's judgment. As an example: If an ambassador were to be asked, what is your opinion of killing another human being, he might respond---I have no opinion on the matter, but my King judges that it is wrong to murder another human being; but if it is without malice, maybe even with sadness, as in necessity due to self-defense, it is not a crime."

I wish to restate what I said above. As an ambassador of God, Jesus did not come to save us as many claim; He came to do the Father's will. It was the Father's will to redeem and save us and give us the Kingdom of God.

Jesus did not come to build a Kingdom for Himself. When He returned to His Father in heavenly places, He turned the Kingdom, with all ownership and rulership, to His Father. He stepped down from His kingly role, becoming a Prince of the Kings of the earth (Revelation 1:5).

1 Corinthians 15:24 KJV

(24) Then cometh the end, when he shall have delivered up the kingdom to God, even the Father; when he shall have put down all rule and all authority and power.

1 Corinthians 15:28 KJV

(28) And when all things shall be subdued unto him, then shall the Son also himself be subject unto him that put all things under him, that God may be all in all.

Jesus again displayed His willingness to do God's will. In the Garden of Gethsemane (Luke 22:42), He asked the Father to allow Him to escape the cross, if it was His will. Evidently, it was the Father's will that Jesus go to the cross, and Jesus gladly agreed to endure the suffering because of the promise of joy that was set before Him when completing the Father's will.

As Jesus hung on the cross, just before His death, God placed all the sins of the world upon Him and all the human spirits that were weak and subject to sinning. That included all people who were alive at that time, all people who would be born, and all people who were then in Paradise. From that moment

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onward, all people would become a brand-new creation, never before seen in human history.

Romans 6:5-6 KJV

(5) For if we have been planted together in the likeness of his death, we shall be also in the likeness of his resurrection:

(6) Knowing this, that our old man is crucified with him, that the body of sin might be destroyed, that henceforth we should not serve sin.

Jesus' human spirit was justly condemned, along with all sin, and all other human spirits, and was judged and sent to hell. He was condemned because of our sinfulness, which He bore.

Matthew 26:28 KJV

(28) For this is my blood of the new testament, which is shed for many for the remission of sins.

Titus 2:14 KJV

(14) Who gave himself for us, that he might redeem us from all iniquity, and purify unto himself a peculiar people, zealous of good works.

Before His crucifixion, God called Jesus and three of His disciples aside to receive an important message from Him.

Matthew 17:3 KJV

(3) And, behold, there appeared unto them Moses and Elias talking with him.

Matthew 17:5 KJV

(5) While he yet spake, behold, a bright cloud overshadowed them: and behold a voice out of the cloud, which said, This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased; hear ye him.

The first point I want to make is that God selected Moses and Elijah to be present and hand the baton of the law and the prophets to Jesus, to carry on in the spirit of grace and truth, entering a completely new age and a new creation.

The second point I would also like to emphasize is that it was the second time that God had spoken aloud, in public, to Jesus. He reassured Jesus, before His journey to the cross, that He loved Him and was pleased with Him. In other words, He would know that what would happen to Him was not the result of His actions, but the result of the will of God being implemented on earth.

But God the Father added something of the greatest importance. He said, "Hear ye Him." The Father was publicly recognizing Jesus' transformation into the Word of God. Although He still had His human spirit, Jesus had made an internal transformation of identity and completely identified Himself as the Word of God. Therefore, when He was crucified and his human spirit was judged guilty and sentenced to hell, He still had the eternal spirit of life, the Word of God within Himself.

I want to share a personal story that I think might help us see how Jesus displayed a child's faith as He died on the cross.

Several years ago, I was playing with my oldest child in the living room and kitchen. She was about three years old. I would toss her in the air while holding her above my head, not far, but she would scream in excitement every time. I needed a short break, so I stepped into the kitchen and stood her on the kitchen counter. My wife spoke to me, and I let my arms drop and turned to speak to her. I noticed from the corner of my eye that my daughter had raised her arms and was going into free-fall face forward. I turned as rapidly as a human being possibly could and grabbed her as her feet hit the floor. I was quite frightened by the incident, as she could have possibly been seriously injured. I thank God that no harm came to her. I started to scold her, but immediately realized it was my mistake. Instead, I told her I loved her, but that game had scared me, and I didn't want to keep playing because she almost got hurt. Her only fault, if it could be called that, was that she trusted me, her father, to catch her because I loved her even though I was not even facing her when she began her fall. That is the faith of a child.

Jesus knew He had been found guilty of all the sins in the world; God had placed all of the defective human spirits capable of sin upon Him, yet He knew the Father loved Him and would never allow Him to go to hell for eternal punishment, and then He released His spirit man into His Father's judgment.

We were in Him as He was resurrected and seated on the throne next to God the Father.

Ephesians 2:6 KJV

(6) And hath raised us up together, and made us sit together in heavenly places in Christ Jesus:

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It was finished, Christ had been judged, we had been judged, and all were sent to hell. But Jesus had the spirit of the Word of God in Himself as His own spirit. God then accomplished the miraculous and took a portion of the spirit of Christ---the Word of God---and placed Him in every human being, manifesting a brand-new creation. Jesus' longest prayer, recorded in John chapter seventeen, had been answered. We were one with Him in spirit. The Apostle Paul said it this way.

Galatians 2:20 KJV

(20) I am crucified with Christ: nevertheless I live; yet not I, but Christ liveth in me: and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God, who loved me, and gave himself for me.

Take notice: the Word of God came with His own faith for us to use! We now only need to learn how to use it. He will willingly assist as needed.

Jesus testified about this experience in a slightly different manner.

Revelation 1:18 KJV

(18) I am he that liveth, and was dead; and, behold, I am alive for evermore, Amen; and have the keys of hell and of death.

We no longer have to fear God's coming judgment. We have been judged, found guilty, and sentenced to hell; nevertheless, we live. Yet it is not we that live, but it is Christ --the Word of God--- who lives within us forever into eternity. Learning to live from the Word of God within us and His faith is a cooperative work of God the Father, the Word of God, the Holy Spirit, and us. This relationship will continue to grow forever (Isaiah 9:6-7).
